COGNITIVE To expand problem-solving and thinking skills, as well as acquire new concepts and information

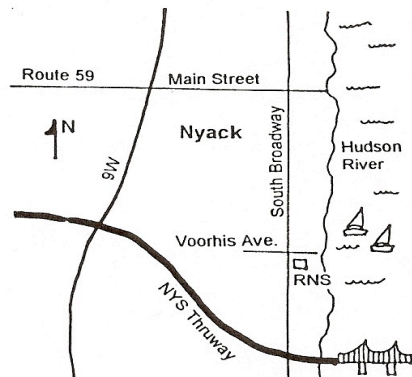
SPIRITUAL To develop a basic awareness of God and appreciate His creation

Riverview Nursery School can be reached by traveling south on Broadway from downtown Nyack. Turn left on Voorhis Ave. for parking and entrance.

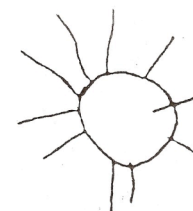


Families are invited to observe classes at the nursery school by appointment. For more information contact the school office.

PROGRAM

Riverview recognizes play and direct exploration as basic tools for learning. We focus on children as individuals who collectively learn from educational and cultural diversity. In this environment, our goal is for students to develop and enhance intellectual and interpersonal abilities that then become life skills.

DAILY ACTIVITIES

ENROLLMENT

Riverview accepts children 2, 3 and 4-years of age, as well as 5-year old children who have not yet attended kindergarten. Completion of the Enrollment Form and payment of the Registration Fee secures a place for your child in our program. Parents are encouraged to visit the classrooms. Registration for fall begins in February and is ongoing throughout the year based on availability.

CALENDAR

Riverview follows the Nyack Public School calendar for holidays, vacations and closings due to inclement weather.

TUITION

Current tuition rates are available by calling the office.

STAFF

Teachers and Assistants are chosen not only for their competence, experience and educational background, but also for their response to/interaction with children and overall character.

FACILITIES

Our spacious facilities include:

- Five large, sunny classrooms
- A well-equipped indoor gym room
- Safe, enclosed playground with climbing structures, sandbox, gazebo, patio and garden areas

Each area of our school is furnished with equipment and materials developmentally appropriate for preschool children. Our classroom resources change weekly to provide a stimulating environment.

CLASS SIZE

A distinctive feature of our program is the limited class size designed to provide for individual attention and to foster a sense of community. Teacher/child ratio:

2-year old children	1:4
3-year old children	1:6
4-year old children	1:7

PARENT-TEACHER COMMUNICATION

Ongoing parent-teacher communication is an important aspect of our program. Scheduled conferences are held in the fall and spring. We also encourage frequent parent-teacher dialogue throughout the year.
